Sub:- Indian Forest Service Examination, 2016 - Medical Examination (Part-I & II) and Walking Test -Regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the above subject, this is to inform you that you were absent in Medical Examination and Walking Test which were scheduled to be conducted on 11.04.2017 and 12.04.2017 at RML Hospital, New Delhi and National Zoological Park (NZN), New Delhi respectively.

2. Your attention is drawn to the Note below rules 2 and 12 of Regulations relating to Physical Examination of candidates contained in Appendix III of Rule 18 of IFS Examination Rules which inter alia reads as:

“.....Provided in case a candidate either fails to complete the walking test within the prescribed time limit or fails to appear in the test, will be given another opportunity to appear in the walking test. In case he/she again fails to appear/pass the test, no further opportunity will be given to him/her to appear in the walking test.”

“.....there is no right of appeal from Medical Board special or standing appointed to determine their fitness for the above service. If, however, Government are satisfied on the evidence produced before them of the possibility of an error of judgement in the decision of the first Board, it is open to Government to allow an appeal to second Board. Such evidence should be submitted within one month of the date of the communication in which the decision of the first Medical Board is communicated to the candidate, otherwise no request for an appeal to a second Medical Board will be considered.

If any medical certificate, produced by a candidate as a piece of evidence about the possibility of an error of judgement, in the decision of the first Board, the certificate will not be taken into consideration unless it contains a note by the medical practitioner concerned to the effect that it has been given in full knowledge of the fact that the candidate has already been rejected as unfit for service by the Medical Board.”

3. In this regard, the fresh schedule will be communicated to you via e-mail after consultation with the the Central Standing Medical Board and NZP, Government of India. You are directed to keep checking your e-mail / official website of Indian Forest Service www.ifs.nic.in for updates in this regard.
