
Sub: Retention of names on offer for Central Deputation under the Central Staffing Scheme for the year 2016- reg.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to invite nominations of officers for appointment on deputation to posts under the Central Staffing Scheme (CSS) for the year 2016. The detailed guidelines for nominating suitable officers are given in Appendix-I. I would request that the guidelines are strictly adhered to, while forwarding the applications of officers.

2. At the outset, I would like to draw your attention to the Central Deputation Reserve (CDR) statement as on 1st November, 2015 enclosed with this letter (Appendix II). The Central Deputation Reserve (CDR) of each State Cadre determines the extent to which officers could be sent on deputation to the Government of India. Not only that the CDR is low, most of the states fail to achieve the proportionate CDR by a wide margin. Column 8 of the CDR statement shows the utilization of the proportionate CDR of each State. Meeting the shortfall in utilization of the proportionate CDR may kindly be considered while forwarding the names of the officers for CSS, especially at Deputy Secretary /Director level.

3. There is a general shortage of IAS Officers at Deputy Secretary/Director level and therefore, you may like to recommend a sufficiently large number of officers for appointment to posts at Deputy Secretary/Director under the Government of India so as to share the shortage proportionately between the Centre & the States. You would agree that the movement of the officers from the States to the Centre and back is also crucial for building up the capabilities at the State level and contributing towards developing national perspectives at the decision-making levels in the Government of India. It would, therefore, be appropriate if a conscious attempt is made to forward the names of officers for deputation under Government of India in such a manner that every eligible officer has an opportunity to serve at the Centre at least once at the middle management level. It has been further decided that preference for appointment at the level of Joint Secretary will be given to those officers who have already done a Central Deputation at the level of Deputy Secretary/Director.

4. Considerable processes are gone through before an officer is appointed under the CSS. However, very often, the Cadre Controlling Authorities (CCAs) withdraw the names of officers from offer at a later stage. This results in undue delay in the placement of officers under the CSS, which is not in public interest. Therefore, you are earnestly requested to ensure that an officer, once placed on the offer list, continues to be available for consideration throughout the year.

5. The Government of India has been following a policy of debarring an officer for five years, if he/she fails to join the post under the CSS either on personal grounds or the refusal of the Cadre to relieve him. It may be noted that withdrawal of the name of an officer after a panel has been recommended by the Civil Services Board results in debarment for five years. As per instructions contained in letter No. 14/1/98-FA(UN) dated 26.2.1998 and No.1/1/2003-FAS, dated 8.5.2003 of DoP&T, an officer who is debarred from being taken on deputation to a post under the CSS is also to be debarred from being given Cadre Clearance for foreign assignments/consultancies abroad during the period of debarment. Therefore the nomination of officers debarred from central deputation may not be forwarded for appointment to posts under the CSS till the period of debarment is over.

6. I would request you to pay particular attention to the following points, while forwarding the names of officers for appointment, under the CSS:
- (i) Sufficient names of women and SC/ST/OBC Officers may be sponsored so that adequate representation can be provided to them on posts under the CSS.
 - (ii) Officers whose names are offered should have completed the necessary 'cooling off'.
 - (iii) The APARs completed up to 31.3.2015 are sent simultaneously as it will be difficult to retain the names of officers with incomplete APARs.

7. An officer being nominated should be willing to serve anywhere in India; preference of an officer for a particular station(s) on account of personal reasons, if any, may be explicitly indicated. The Officers should also indicate three preferences for Departments/Ministries where they would like to work under the CSS. However, actual appointments will be subject to availability of posts and the suitability of officers for the posts.

8. The online application form for applying for the CSS for the year 2016 is available on the Ministry's website, <http://www.persmin.gov.in>. The format of the application form is enclosed, and the following may be noted:

9. Only those applications that have been validated electronically by the Nodal Officers will be accepted for retention. All the Nodal Officers may be requested to ensure that details in Annexure-I to IV are duly filled in and complete in all respects. In case of change of the existing Nodal Officer, details along with e-mail I.D. of the Nodal Officer may be intimated to this Office.


10. It is observed that the applications of officers who have applied for the CSS, are often forwarded for some other posts without consulting O/o the Establishment Officer. It is, therefore, requested that the names of officers forwarded for retention under the CSS may not be recommended for some other posts without consulting this Division.

11. The extant Rules relating to the CSS permit officers in the higher pay scale in their parent cadres to come on deputation under the CSS in lower pay scale. Department of Expenditure has issued clarification in this regard vide their O.M. No. 1/1/2008-IC, dated 13.09.2008 to regulate fixation of pay. The clarification provides that in case a Government servant goes on deputation to lower grade pay, his pay in pay band would continue unchanged, but he will be granted the grade pay of lower post for the entire deputation period. Further, the officers posted under the CSS will be granted one increment on account of NFU, but their grade pay will remain unchanged as they are holding a tenure post. Officers retained at Deputy Secretary level may get the benefit of pay fixation at higher Grade Pay on grant of NFSG & may be re-designated as Director on completing 14 years of service as on 1st July of that year.

12, The names of officers nominated for Joint Secretary level for CSS may kindly be sent to Deputy Secretary (SM) and those for Deputy Secretary/Director level may be sent to Deputy Secretary (MM). I would request you to forward the names keeping in view the above mentioned requirements, by 31st January, 2016. Given the procedural delays in receiving offers from the CCAs and consequential delays in finalizing the 'Offer List' for the year 2016, we presume your concurrence in operating the 'Offer List' of 2015 till 31.3.2016.

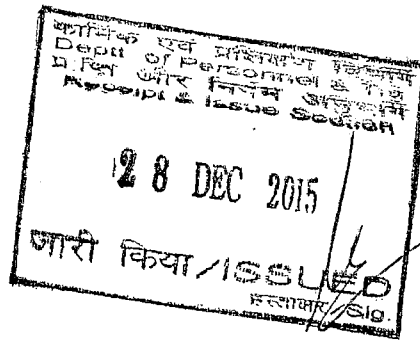

Action Taken Note/Reply to the recommendations/observations contained in 85th Report of the Department related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Personnel, Public Grievances, Law and Justice, on the Demands for Grants (2016-17) of the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions.

Sl. No	Para No. of the Recommendation / observation	Text of the recommendation / observations as mentioned in the Report	Reply/Action Taken
1	43.3	The Committee desires that this Department should play a role as an apex level coordination entity for addressing the grievances of pensioners. The Committee is of the firm belief that pension is a right and not merely a privilege. It welcomes the initiatives 'Bhavishya', 'Sankalp' and 'Anubhav' and hopes that maximum pensioners will be benefited by these initiatives. The Committee, at the same time is very much concerned about their welfare and accordingly recommends that nodal officers should be appointed in every Department including PSUs in their respective establishments to attend to the welfare of pensioners and represent them if required to the concerned authorities	Implementation of pension policy is dealt with in respective Ministries/Departments and their subordinate formations, from where the employee retires as well as the pension disbursing authority. Nodal Officers for pension related grievances have been nominated in all Ministries/ Departments. Details are available on the Pensioners' Portal website. Since the matters relating to welfare of pensioners (except policy issues) are to be dealt with by respective Ministries/ Departments, the recommendations of the Standing Committee as made in para 43.3 have been communicated to all Ministries/ Departments including those regarding appointment of Nodal Officers for pensioners welfare in every PSU and will be followed up.
2	43.4	The Committee feels that every public servant will eventually become a pensioner in their lifetime. The Trade Union and Employees/Officers Union of Organisations/Departments may be allowed to negotiate with their employer for improvement of the post-retirement issues along with the existing service conditions. The Government can also use the expertise of the post retiree citizens productively in various fields in order to boost their morale and give them renewed zest to life. The Government should also approach the elder citizens (retirees) in positive way by calling annual meetings and discuss their	With a view to use the expertise of pensioners productively the Department has launched a web enabled application - Sankalp which aims at channelizing skill, experience and time available with retired government servants into meaningful, voluntary contribution to society. This would add to the social capital of the country and at the same time restore dignity and purpose to life post-retirement. <i>contd....p2/</i>

It is a useful forum for holding consultation with the pensioners through their Associations and provides them an opportunity for raising their problem directly before the concerned Ministries, as the official of these Ministries are also present in the meeting. The meetings of SCOVA also provide valuable feedback to the Government for effective implementation of the programmes and give direction for the future course of action. Due representation has been given to various Pensioners' Associations in the SCOVA. The meeting of SCOVA is held twice a year and are chaired by Hon'ble MOS (PP).</p> <p>The recommendation of the Standing Committee, as made out in para 43.4 of their subject Report, have been brought to the notice of all Ministries/ Departments for further appropriate action.</p>
